
Dear Mr. Summers:

Congratulations on being a recipient of the Fort Valley State University Presidential Scholarship. I applaud your determination to get a degree in civil engineering from Georgia Tech.

In your letter dated March 17, 2006, you wanted to know if your Presidential Scholarship would allow you to participate in the Cooperative Developmental Energy Program (CDEP). The answer is yes. However, you need to be aware that you must maintain a 3.30 GPA to keep your Presidential Scholarship which will require you to be totally focused. If you are able to maintain your Presidential Scholarship with a major in mathematics, CDEP will provide you a scholarship to attend Georgia Tech. However, CDEP's scholarships pay in-state tuition, room and board, and applicable fees. You and your family will be responsible for paying the out-of-state tuition in your attendance at Georgia Tech, which can be relatively expensive. I suggest that you go on line to ascertain the cost of out-of-state tuition at Georgia Tech. Georgia Tech is the only one of CDEP's partnering universities that does not waive out-of-state tuition.

Again, congratulations on receiving the FVSU Presidential Scholarship and we are proud to welcome you into the Fort Valley State University Family.
